



### President's Column Linda Cooper

**Shalom** 

It was great to see so many of you at services, classes, movies and events this past month.

With all these activities going on at Temple, the building is now showing its age of almost 40 years. Right now, our greatest need is replacing the roof. The part of the roof over the Chapel and Sanctuary requires



immediate attention. There are also structural elements that are in need of replacement.

Our Capital Campaign, which is now in its initial stages, is designed to raise funds to cover the expenses of replacement, repairs and remodeling. When you are asked to help us financially, please give generously so that we take care of our immediate needs and prepare for our next 40 years.

Temple security is another important project. Two of our members, Jan and Bill Schwartz, have spent many hours gathering information and writing a grant application to obtain funds to harden our defenses. The application first goes to the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FL FEMA) for approval. All applications are then graded and forwarded to the Department of Homeland Security/FEMA on the federal level where the final decisions are made. This process is open to all nonprofit organizations in the country. Since the shootings in Pittsburgh, PA and Poway, CA, there is fierce competition for the funds. This process will take several months. These funds are for security equipment only. It is hoped that with all their hard work, we will receive some funding. Thank you again, Jan and Bill Schwartz.

Now for part three of this article. We have been approached by Ruth and Norman Rales Jewish Family Services to do a feasibility study of our campus, since they have outgrown their location in Boca Raton. One option to be considered is to determine the possibility to develop some plans for expansion on Temple grounds which already houses the Weisman Center. JFS will pay for the feasibility study and will then share the results with us. The Temple Board of Directors voted unanimously to proceed. Once the results are obtained, which may take 3 to 6 months, we will share them with the congregation. Temple Anshei Shalom will always remain Temple Anshei Shalom.

Have a great summer! Remember, TAS will be open all summer. See you in Temple.

### Rabbí's Column Rabbí Raphael Adler

Israel sneaks up on you when you least expect it with a tug at the heart and a wellspring of tears. Have you ever toured an Israel Naval Forces submarine? Of course not, unless you were with us in Haifa. At the Navy Museum, a former skipper of the INS Gal, now a retired admiral gave us the VIP treatment on his beloved "fish".



I asked him how long he was submerged, and he told me up to three weeks at a time. Seders,

Yom Kippur, Shabbat were all observed deep under the ocean. He pointed to a small area and said that this is our synagogue. A metal closet had a sign "Aron HaKodesh". It was an Ark with a Torah. Only in an Israeli submarine.

When we ponder the ease of visiting Israel, a non-stop jet from Miami to Ben Gurion via El Al is all we have to worry about. But climbing on board the only surviving clandestine, illegal immigration ship that averted the British and secretly made its way from Europe to Palestine, carrying survivors of the Holocaust, we are brought back to a frightening Pre-State era. The "Af Al Pe Kein" is a living time warp. Remaining exactly as it was when homeless Jews made the perilous voyage home, never knowing if they would be sunk by the British or sent to a detention camp in Cypress. The crammed wooden sleeping quarters looked to us and must have seemed to the passengers like concentration camp barracks, and yet as the ship's name reads-even so we endured and survived and thrived.

When we offer Kabbalat Shabbat, the traditional service on Friday Evening, often we are reminded of Tzfat, that holy mystical town where the Lecha Dodi was composed. We experienced a breathtaking sunset on those ancient cobblestoned hills.

However, now when I celebrate Shabbat, the image of Tel Aviv forms an indelible picture in my mind. Yes, hectic, secular Tel Aviv.

On our hotel veranda, overlooking the boardwalk and beach, with throngs of electric scootering, bike riding, dog walking, building sand castles, and other leisure activities going on as we prayed together, I was struck by what an amazing experience we were having.

Everyone was Jewish. Everyone was celebrating Shabbat in their own way, and everyone was playing their active role in the vibrant miracle of the rebirth of Israel. Anywhere else it would just be a beach scene, but here on Friday night, it was a joy to behold.

The laughter of the children, the soft sounds of Hebrew conversation, and the couples strolling hand in hand in Israel represent no less than the Prophets words transformed into reality. I can't wait to return. Perhaps you will join me!

Kitchen – The reorganization of both kitchens is ongoing under the direction of Mitchel Abramowitz, Ritual VP, Gayle Savitz, Hella Reitman and Susan Lubliner. They will be scheduling orientation sessions to teach the workings of the kitchen to volunteer monitors so they can observe the food servers at all times when food is served to assure proper handling of food, supplies and equipment. ### Security Mort Cooper

In 2018, there were approximately 6.8 million Jews living in the U.S., which is about 2.1 % of the total population. Also, in 2018, there were 1879 incidents against Jews or Jewish institutions. Last year, in Pittsburgh, PA, 11 members of Tree of Life Synagogue were killed and 7 injured, This year, in Poway, CA, 1 person was killed and 3 injured at a Chabad.

Temple Anshei Shalom will continue to have two armed guards on duty during Friday night and Saturday morning services. This decision will help give you continued peace of mind and continued safety. We are working diligently to harden our defenses. At the beginning of May, a grant application was submitted to the Department of Homeland Security for funds to purchase equipment such as cameras, monitors, motion detectors, improved lighting, etc. This application was written by Jan and Bill Schwartz. They did a great job in a short period of time.

You may have noticed that some chairs against the gray divider at the back of the Sanctuary have been removed and the spaces left empty to accommodate folded walkers during services. There are now no obstructions in the aisles. I, the Committee, others with walkers and those carrying the Torahs thank you. It may be an inconvenience to some, but it is for increased safety, security and adherence to Fire Department regulations. Remember to put prominent identification tape or tags on your walkers as many look very similar. One of our members counted an average of 40 walkers and canes for three consecutive weeks during Shabbat morning services. If you need help with your walker, hold up your hand and somebody will assist you.

Summer is quickly approaching and, as much as I hate to remind you, hurricane season begins June 1. Start getting your supplies now and make sure you have matches or a lighter, flashlight and batteries, and a hand-operated can opener!

The We All Care committee, including our Mitzvah Knitters, Get Well card writer, and our Community connectors wish you a wonderful summer.



### **30th Anniversary of TAS Holocaust Memorial**

As we celebrate the 30th anniversary of the beautiful monument on the grassy island just outside our front door, many TAS members might not know some interesting facts about it.

It was dedicated in 1989 (just five years after the synagogue was completely finished) by congregants, friends and Holocaust survivors of Temple Anshei Shalom. It is dedicated to "the millions of martyred men,

women and children who perished during the Holocaust Period, 1939-1945."

The 3,000-pound, copper sculpture sits on a hexagon mortar base, faced with granite. It contains the ashes of a Holocaust survivor along with prayer books and talleisim that were salvaged from the Holocaust. Six vertical arches represent the 6 million Jews who perished during the Holocaust.



Survivor Abe Peseck came up with the idea. Temple officials voted to donate the grounds for its use. A 12-member fundraising committee spent three years raising money to pay for it.

Hungarian artist Ferenc Varga, whose parents were Holocaust survivors, spent a year creating it. The word "remember" is engraved on the sculpture in English and Hebrew.

The monument was severely damaged by vandals in 1994. After repairs were made, brick pavers and landscaping were added, along with bench seating for meditation, thanks to the generosity of donors.

After each Yom Hashoah program at TAS, attendees walk in procession to the monument for the Mourner's Kaddish, songs and blowing of the Shofar.

"Legacy Legends" is a new recognition program designed to salute individuals who designate Temple Anshei Shalom as a beneficiary in a will, trust, annuity or other financial instrument.

"Our Temple has benefited in the past from devoted congregants who left their mark by earmarking a gift for TAS," says Irwin Schultz, who initiated the new program. "But we don't want to wait until someone is gone before we show our appreciation for their generous intentions. Through "Legacy Legends", we can say 'thank you' now."

One of the program's elements is a new KOL column, "Legacy Legends" where benefactors, who are willing, will share their motivation for making TAS a beneficiary. There is no minimum amount to qualify for the recognition program. To kick off "Legacy Legends", here's the story of member Renee S. Gere who has made TAS her primary beneficiary.

"I moved to Florida after my husband Kenny died. Though I hadn't been active with a Synagogue in Connecticut for several years, I had been active previously, even serving as Second Gabbai. I missed the sense of community. I called TAS before coming for a Shabbat morning service to make sure Miss Tish, my service dog, would be welcome and was told yes. However, several attendees that morning made us feel very unwelcome.

"But I didn't want to give up on TAS. So I summoned my courage and went into the office to describe my experience. Within 15 minutes, Fran Goldman phoned to invite me to

a Friday evening service. And she made sure my reception was much different.

"After that, I never left. The Temple has truly become my family. Whenever I've needed a shoulder to cry on, a late night ride to the ER or drug store, a bowl of chicken soup, a friend to go with me on a trip to and back from Orlando to pick up my aunt...whatever I've needed, someone from TAS has been there. From Paulette, to Rabbi Adler and Frannie, to Gayle and others. And Miss Tish feels at home, too.

"In 2016, I met with trust attorney Jami Huber in Boca to establish a trust, a fairly easy process. Since Kenny and I had no children and my brother, nieces and nephews are fine financially, I decided to leave a significant percentage of my estate to my Temple family. The balance is going to MasonicCare in Wallingford, Connecticut, who cared for Kenny. Miss Tish has her own trust. Some people have asked me if a Synagogue is as deserving as a medical research or social service charity. I tell them Temple Anshei Shalom has become my second home and the people here are my family. What can be more deserving than that? Sure, we've had some spats--who doesn't argue with family? But I know they will always be there for me.


"A saying by Richard Bach sums it up for me: 'The bond that links your true family is not one of blood but of respect and joy in each other's


