Every Jewish Festival is a time of heightened joy or simcha, but there is no celebration as deeply associated with this emotion as Sukkot. We are enjoined by the Torah repeatedly to feel joy at this season.



Of course, our annual celebration is when joy is found in a flimsy temporary hut and waving a quartet of plants. Not exactly suggestive of simcha. Yet the magic of Sukkot is understood in relation to Yom Kippur, which it follows by just a few days.

On Yom Kippur we plead for our very existence. Health, well-being, peace and life are in the balance for the entire day. Sukkot then is the commemoration of forgiveness and a renewed gift of a blessed year bestowed upon us by the Almighty.

Therefore, Sukkot's lesson to us is how to experience real joy. Most people are unable to achieve the sensation of true simcha because they take life for granted. At least until it is almost taken away.

When you survive a serious car accident, you are never the same again. When one is healed from a deadly cancer or some other serious disease, the simplest and most routine acts become infused with deep appreciation. The survivor, or patient, goes around giddy, feeling the sensation of pure unadulterated joy.

You would think they won the Power Ball! But they received something even better, a new found appreciation in just being alive.

Our limbs work, we are able to utilize our senses to breath in the miracle of existence.

It truly does not get better than that.

Happiness is not happening as an external present; happiness is a state of mind. You can acquire the whole world and be miserable and you can have very little and feel unbelievable joy.

Sukkot then is about fostering this mindset at least for a week following our new lease on life. Living in a hut is better than the swankiest resort when you realize that to swallow food, lay your head on a pillow, and enjoy the company of loved ones is joyful beyond words. Yes, shaking a lulav and holding an etrog can't be confused with expensive jewelry or a fancy car. But what will those things give you when you really think about it, when your soul craves simple simcha.

Fulfill the Mitzvah of Writing a Torah Scroll

Temple Anshei Shalom invites all of our members, their friends and family, and all of the Jewish community to participate in this opportunity to fulfill the mitzvah of writing a new Torah Scroll.

You can fulfill the mitzvah, even by writing one letter of the Torah, since the lack of one letter causes the Torah to be invalid. Every letter, word sentence, or weekly portion, or any other selection you make, is a meaningful way to participate.

We hope everyone will join in this once in a lifetime opportunity to fulfill the mitzvah of writing a Torah Scroll. Even if you have done this before, it is still another opportunity to perform a mitzvah.

You may select particular portions of the Torah that have a special meaning for you or your family, such as a weekly portion or maftir associated with a bar/bat mitzvah or wedding. You may also dedicate selected passages, such as the Ten Commandments or the Shema.

Your dedication can be a memorial to a loved one, or to record a Simcha, such as the birth of a grandchild or great grandchild.

You will all be invited to observe and participate in the actual completion of the Torah by our Scribe, Rabbi Moshe Klein, on Sunday, December 15. This will be followed by a traditional ceremony and march into the Temple.

All those that participate will be given a certificate to remember the occasion for themselves and those they are honoring or remembering.

The funds raised from this mitzvah of writing a Torah Scroll will help to install a new roof over the sanctuary and chapel, which are in urgent need of replacement.

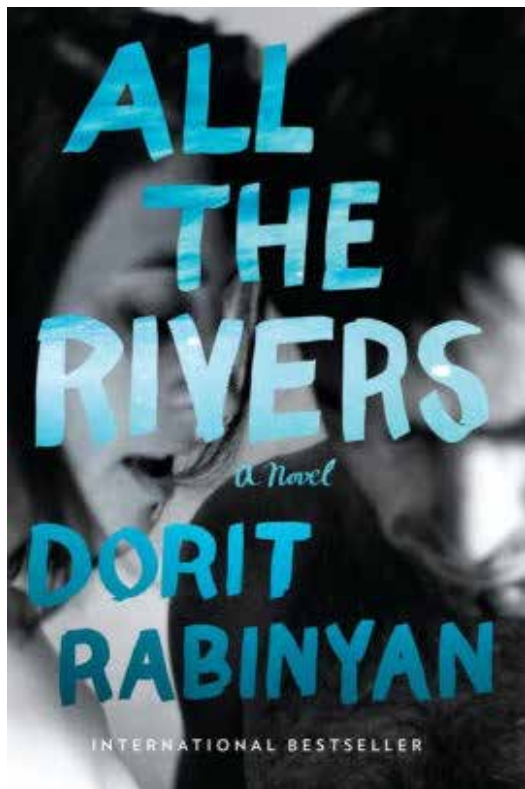

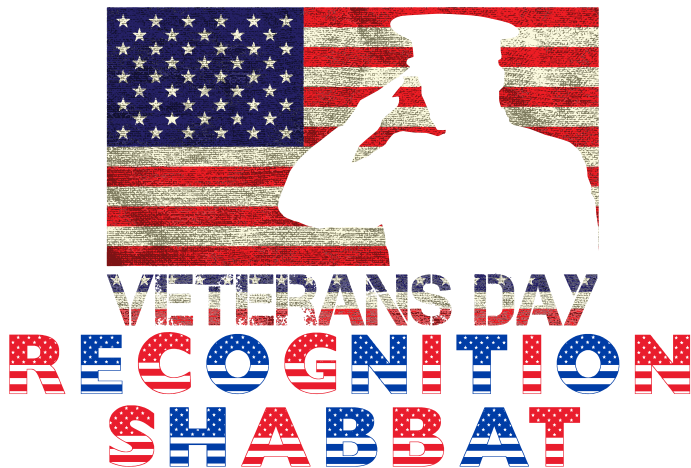

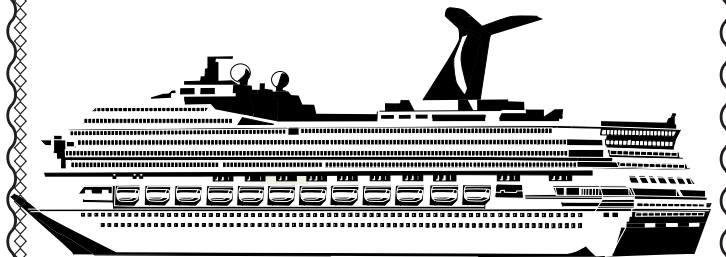
