President's Column

L'Shana Tova!

Today is Yom Kippur. Part of the preparation and avodah (prayer) for today is to make a personal accounting: To think about one's actions during the past year, where one succeeded, where one needs to improve, and to make a plan to do better this coming year.



As President of Temple Anshei Shalom, I will now deliver the annual State of the Temple address.

All businesses operate on a budget and Temple Anshei is no different. The Temple budget goes from January 1st to December 31st.

The primary part of the annual budget is the Operating Fund. This fund is comprised of your dues, Kol Nidre pledges, donations and fund-raising activities. From this income, we need to pay our clergy – Rabbi Adler, Cantor Beleniski and Rabbi Polirer, our office staff – Melissa, Jannette and Jo Anne, our maintenance staff – Rolly, Chad, Marc and Paul, and all of our daily expenses. This fund also enables the Temple to provide our members and guests with Shabbat and holiday services, two daily minyans, holiday celebrations and educational opportunities such as Lifelong Learning, Lunch and Learn, yoga, bridge, mitzvah knitting group and our We All Care group. Additionally, the Temple provides entertainment with our weekly movies and discussions with Rabbi Adler, Anshei After Dark, the Cantor's concert, our annual GALA and special fundraising events. To operate the Temple costs about \$60,000 a month.

Approximately 53,000 people have come through our doors this past year to take advantage of all the services and activities the Temple offers. These 53,000 people include repeat congregants and guests who support the Temple.

We also have a Security Committee which was formed the beginning of this year. Our Security Committee, in conjunction with the Palm Beach Sheriff's Office, the Fire and Rescue Department, is working to make Temple Anshei Shalom safer by holding evacuation drills, offering classes such as basic first-aid and having a rolling cart filled with first-aid supplies. This year, in addition to our two regular guards, PBSO is providing a Deputy Sheriff to be on duty during all High Holy Day services at no charge to us.

Another part of our budget is the Capital Fund. This fund is used to upgrade and/or replace equipment and building facilities. Currently we have a situation that requires immediate attention. The

Rabbi's Column

November is a month replete with memorable occasions, including Veterans Day and Thanksgiving weekend. But I would like to draw your attention to a lesser known commemoration this month: November is Family Stories Month.



Since the holiday season begins, Family Stories Month is an opportunity, in our fast-paced, frenetic, virtually connected world, to actually pause and spend time together. The official website offers a variety of ideas. I have adapted several of them to share with you in the hope that you might consider implementing them during your grandchildren's upcoming visits with you.

Tell stories about your youth. Grandchildren love to hear tales of "long ago". They bring laughter or spark new questions. Relive personal experiences of anti-semitism, of Jewish pride, how you felt visiting Israel for the first time. Flip through photos or share memories which will leave an indelible bond between the generations. Recollections of Bar Mitzvahs, Hebrew School, Jewish weddings, shul and JCC dances, all form a cherished link to your past that your little ones will truly love. They also serve as subtle ways to reinforce your hope that they will create Jewish memories as well.

Start an annual tradition with your grandchildren. Bake a favorite recipe for Shabbat, share a loved Yiddish melody, take out that special memento or ritual item that holds so many beautiful memories for you. Play that card game or board game with them that you enjoyed as a child. Just do something together without technology which will build lasting and strong connections to last years and years.

For veterans and spouses, while you or your husband most likely rarely, if ever, reminisced on your military service, whether due to modesty or the pain of reliving those years, please note that once you both are gone, those memories unsaid die too. Sharing the fear, the misery, the loneliness, and the pride of serving in uniform, especially in battle, teaches your family sacrifice, courage, the cost of freedom, how to handle difficult situations, and much more, opening precious windows into your inner self. While it is understandably difficult for many, it is also a powerful opportunity to teach your future valuable lessons learned at a very high price.

Remember, you are the story keepers and memory makers for your descendants. You are the living link to your Jewish past, especially your parents and grandparents. Judaism reinforces through the Sh'ma, "Veshinantam livanecha", to teach our children. We are their professors of Yiddishkeit, of family, and of life. If we make our opportunities to impart lessons to them fun, exciting, engaging and personal, they will be enthralled and carry forth our words and lessons to their own children and grandchildren too.

May we teach them well.

roof over this Sanctuary and the Chapel are in need of replacement. We plan to do this replacement by the end of this year. The estimated cost for these two sections of the roof is \$130,000.

We hired a professional fund raiser to help us with our Capital Campaign. The campaign, in its first phase, has had support from the Executive Board, the Board of Directors and others. Following Sukkot, we will be asking the congregation for contributions and pledges.

We are also working with the Ruth and Norman Rales Jewish Family Services to determine the feasibility to increase their presence on this campus. They are paying for this study. So far, it has been determined that a second floor on both buildings is not possible. JFS cannot afford to construct a parking garage here. JFS is investigating the possibility of purchasing land on either side of us. You will be kept informed of this situation.

We are fortunate to have elected officers, a Board of Directors and many volunteers who have generously donated their time, effort and finances to ensure that the Temple operates efficiently with the funds available.

Returning to Yom Kippur, between the beginning of services at 9:00 am this morning and the blowing of the shofar tonight at 7:48 pm, including the community service this afternoon, we will have had about 1600 members and guests who will have attended our services today. That is another tribute to what we offer. We thank you for your participation and support.

Temple Anshei Shalom will need your ongoing support so that the Temple can grow, flourish and continue to service our members and the community. We have a great congregation of about 700 members, a promising future and a building that needs attention. It is up to all of us to ensure that Temple Anshei Shalom remains vibrant for many years to come.

In conclusion, after taking stock of the Temple, this is where we are now and how we plan to enhance the Temple during the coming years. This year we are celebrating our 40th anniversary. As you think about the various areas of your life, such as your relationships with G-d, with yourself, with family and with others, please also consider your relationship with Temple Anshei Shalom. Your participation and support will enhance the growth of the Temple over the coming years, as well as the Temple's ability to serve the needs of the membership and community.

May you be inscribed and sealed in the Book of Life for a healthy, sweet, prosperous, and peaceful New Year.

SIMCHAT TORAH HONOREES

Fifty-seven years ago, Sandy and David Didner were under the Chuppah honoring the sanctity of marriage. On Simchat Torah, they are once again under the Chuppah as Temple Anshei Shalom, their chosen spiritual home, honors them as our Hattan & Kallah Torah!

David's education at Yeshiva Tel Aviv formed his spiritual life, and he utilizes it frequently to chant Torah at the Monday and Thursday Minyans. He is a Men's Club member and the State of Israel is grateful for his service in the Six Day War, as he fought in the Straits of Tiran. During his three and a half years of service in the Israeli Army he oversaw a reserve artillery unit and achieved the rank of sergeant major. Since his arrival to the United States in 1961, he was a successful businessman in the meat packing business.

Judaism teaches that a father should teach his children to swim. David has gone even further, as two of his grandchildren also chant Torah. All of his children and grandchildren attended or are attending Yeshivas. Two granddaughters are spending a semester in an Israeli high school. Two grandsons participated in the Birthright Programs. Recently, David presented his oldest son a 130-year Torah that he owned from his family's personal collection of three Torahs. Few people know that he also lived in Siberia during World War II where Judaism became his lifeline and passion.

Sandy answered the call without hesitation when a new leader for the book discussion group was needed. So many TAS people benefited from her literary expertise that she still shares with her students at Palm Beach State College. Sandy was on the TAS Board, is a member of Sisterhood, an usher at High

Holiday services for the past four years, serves on the Scholar in Residence Committee and nearly every Shabbat can be found sitting with David enjoying Rabbi Adler's fabulous Torah insights and Cantor Beleniski's renditions of the Liturgy. Sandy is an author of the book *The Conspiracies of Dreams* which is 95% based on David's family during the Six Day War and reveals how Israel acquired the atomic

bomb. This year she will release a children's book of poems, *The Magic Fountain* illustrated by TAS member Shelly Lazarus.

"Ever since we joined nearly 5 years ago, we continue to be amazed by everyone's friendliness and feeling of belonging from the clergy, congregants, office staff, and maintenance. David stated. "We especially look forward to our monthly TAS Chavurah where we discuss Jewish topics" Sandy added.

How fitting it is to honor this couple on Simchat Torah, walking down the aisle again as their lives are surrounded by Torah, its teachings, Jewish sanctity and simchas!

5. 251+ The Minnyannaires' Leader Award Certificate, invitation to participate in Minnyannaires Shabbat Service, the Leader Award given on the Bimah, special Kippah and your name on plaque
6. Highest attendance Best Attendance TAS Kippah, invitation to present a small speech about Minyan, brick on our tribute wall in the hallway with a certificate.

There will be 2 separate categories morning and afternoon!

Yahrzeit year does not count and Yahrzeit days do not count.

Those who attended regularly during a Yahrzeit year will be mentioned in a bulletin at a Yizkor Service. Shabbat and Holidays do not count. Must be TAS Member Being a Minnyannaire is your life line. You can always phone a friend to join you or ask a congregant to help you with the prayers. Let your final answer be yes! I want to be known as a Minnyannaire!
